

## FUELING TEAM EXPANSION'S ABILITY TO GROW

When two streams merge, they call it a confluence. When three or four rivers merge, it creates a powerful, nearly unstoppable force. Now if we're describing the effects of damaging waters and crashing waves, that could be a problem. If we're talking about the power of God meshing perfectly with catalysts that undergird His Kingdom, that's something exciting!

Here are several key catalysts that are fueling Team Expansion's growth into tomorrow:

- Kairos: Kairos is a week-long encounter with the heart of God for global redemption. Participants learn about the biblical perspective of missions, the historical backdrop, strategy, and even basics in the challenges of working cross-culturally. By God's power, we've helped more than 600 people through the course in South America, North Africa, Southeast Asia, South Asia, and the USA.
- Jonathan Training: This course trains apostolicallygifted team leaders to design and implement powerful plans for launching church-planting movements among unreached peoples. 35 of our 45 team leaders are already putting it to use.

- 3. High Impact Volunteer Training: This material has helped other organizations ramp up their teams of volunteers from 5 to 5,000. We've already run several team members through the training and two more are set to attend in January. We've appointed Bob Gibson as our new VP of Volunteer Services. Bob, himself, has volunteered with us full-time since 1997.
- 4. Emerald Hills: As a training base, Emerald Hills has unleashed a capacity that we never imagined. We've trained hundreds of workers since moving here in March 2009. I'm convinced that the best years are in front of us. But first, we need to cover all the expenses for Phase I construction. With \$2 million dollars already paid, we have just \$1.44 million to go. Please pray with us that God will raise up a donor to make a major gift of \$1.5 million to completely position us for future growth.

Thank you for fueling the confluence of these powerful rivers of blessings for unreached peoples, for His Kingdom, and for His glory!
